#### Considerations:

- Students enrolled in the Advanced GCS Track may only spend no more than one semester abroad.
- Before studying away, students are strongly encouraged to complete the GCHN-SHU 110
   The Concept of China and at least one GCS elective. Students who wish to study in global sites other than New York ideally complete 5 to 6 GCS courses.
- In terms of the 13 NYU study away sites, the majority of GCS courses will be offered at NYU
  New York. Students are encouraged to explore <u>International Exchange Programs</u> such as
  Waseda University, Nagoya University, and Yonsei University, etc, to continue their academic
  interests in GCS.
- It is possible to study away at a global location and take no courses that count towards the GCS major while staying on track for graduation.
- Students planning to study away for two semesters are strongly encouraged to spend the first semester in a location other than New York. Applicants who spend the first semester away in another location will receive priority consideration for New York in their second semester away.
- Students who wish to spend two semesters in New York will need to submit a proposal for the second semester demonstrating a compelling academic rationale.
- Students who plan to study in <u>New York</u>, should consider following:
  - o Students should anticipate registering for courses either at the College of Arts and Science (CAS) or Gallatin School of Individualized Study, among others.
  - o Students can find more GCS related courses from the College of Arts and Science's East Asian Studies, Politics, and History departments.
  - o Students may begin registering for approved CAS courses the first week of registration when their assigned registration window opens.
  - o Each semester, there are many courses taught in New York that are often close to students who are not matriculated majors in the course's sponsoring department; this means they often fill with matriculated NY majors before the majority of students, including students from NYUAD and NYUSH, register for courses. However, a number of these courses are also offered at other global locations, where they are generally open to all students.
  - Students who wish to be part of the Washington DC Leadership Program ideally plan to apply for junior fall.
  - NYU New York maintains a <u>campus-wide list</u> covering these courses, along with alternative locations, for the benefit of NYUAD and NYUSH students. All students should consult this list before selecting a study away location and should not include any listed course in their study plans for a semester away in New York.
