



GRADER Introduction to Comparative Politics

NYU Shanghai is currently inviting applications for graders in the field of Comparative Politics. Duties include giving feedback and submitting an initial grade to be confirmed by the instructor ([Ivan Willis Rasmussen](#)) for three (3) assignments in the Introduction to Comparative Politics course. The assignments include: 1) a country memo that explores the political/economic characteristics of one country using primary source data; 2) a "debates on democratization" essay that examines the trade-offs between democracy and development cross-nationally; and 3) a midterm exam that is based on knowledge of key terms/definitions and short answer to questions in the field of comparative politics. In addition, the grader will offer two hours of consultation for students during the week after graded assignments are returned. Altogether, the time demand will not exceed 10 hours on average per week including grading, reading relevant texts, discussion with the instructor, and interaction with students.

Applications are due by October 1, 2017 and review will begin immediately, for appointments in the Spring 2018 semester, pending administrative and budgetary approvals. To be considered, applicants should submit a *curriculum vitae* and a short statement about teaching interests and experience. (No more than one page). This is a part-time position and the eligible candidate must already have working permissions in China and a valid FEC.
